A MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

Have you ever thought of how gratitude or giving thanks (thanksgiving) might contribute to contentment? How do we experience contentment? How do we experience satisfaction, even spiritually? I think gratitude, when it penetrates to our core, has the ability to help us feel fortunate, blessed, and deeply content with the goodness and grace of God. That's what "counting your blessings" or "taking stock of your life" or prayers of gratitude actually do - they help us cherish the goodness of God in any given moment and feel deeply content.

There is actually an interesting Jewish tradition associated with the Passover Seder that functions as a trigger for gratitude and contentment. It is a song with the refrain in Hebrew, "Dayenu." Dayenu means "it would have been enough (sufficient)." The narrative of the Exodus is sung and remembered through the narrative of the song. Dayenu is like the chorus. It is the repeating refrain. With each segment that remembers and recounts God's saving action, it says - even if you had done just a portion of what you did as our savior/redeemer, it would have been enough. It would have been sufficient grace. It would have prompted our joy, worship and celebration of salvation. It would have been enough. Your grace is sufficient. Thank you.

The irony at times of abundance, especially like Thanksgiving when our plates are overflowing, is we are tempted to take it for granted. When we are full and satisfied, as Deuteronomy 8 says, we fail to remember the source of our blessing and give genuine thanks to God. The holiday, or holy-day of Thanksgiving, like all holidays as holy days, prompts us to consider deeply the goodness, gifts and grace of God in our lives. Even a portion of God's goodness would be enough to celebrate. Can we experience contentment, satisfaction, gratitude and even worship as a result? We can - if we celebrate the sufficiency of God's grace.

There was a moment in seminary when I only had one can of Campbell's chicken noodle soup, the heal of a piece of bread, and a half jar of peanut butter in the cabinet. That was all. It was a cold winter day. I sat alone at a parsonage dining room table. I bowed my head to pray and said, "Lord, you said to give thanks in all circumstances... so I thank you for this Campbell's chicken noodle soup, this heal piece of bread and peanut butter, and this glass of water for lunch. Help me enjoy it, to not be afraid of where my next meal is coming from, and be truly thankful." I ate the meager lunch and by the true grace of God, felt thankful and content. Dayenu. God's grace is sufficient in the moment. It prompts us to give thanks and be content in all circumstances. May it be so for all of us this Thanksgiving and beyond, even amid Covid-19 and in a historically difficult time. Remember, God's grace is always sufficient. All is well. Thanks be to God.
